MONARCH GARDEN VOLUNTEER WORK DAY - APRIL 20

The Joslin PTA Campus Beautification Committee needs all hands on deck to help transform our Monarch Garden into a usable educational space for all to enjoy.



In celebration of Earth Day, the Joslin community will have the chance to come together on April 20th to rebuild the school's Monarch Garden. First built by Mrs. Branch and her kindergarten class to create a layover for the migratory and vulnerable monarch butterfly, the garden became overgrown with weeds due to lack of use and maintenance during the coronavirus pandemic. The PTA has been active in the last two years to recreate this important asset for our school community.

In order to fund the restoration of the garden, the PTA secured the Monarch Heroes Butterfly Grant from the National Wildlife Federation in the 2022/2023 school year and the Bright Green Futures Grant from the City of Austin Office of Sustainability this year. Between these two grants, and some additional funding provided by the PTA, the Monarch Garden can now be planted with native, low-water perennials, shrubs and ornamental trees, specifically selected for their benefit to monarch butterflies and other pollinator species.

To make the garden accessible and comfortable for school-wide use, an outdoor classroom will be located in the center of the garden. Salvaged log seating, a shade sail, an outdoor blackboard and a picnic table will allow teachers to take their classes outside for fresh air and first hand scientific observation. Research has shown that outdoor learning can have a huge impact on student mental health, creativity, and academic performance with teachers reporting fewer behavioral issues and increased focus both inside and outside of the classroom when children are able to spend more time outdoors (Children in Nature Network, North American Association for Environmental Education). We are excited and proud to provide a setting for outdoor education for our Joslin Jaguars and our amazing teachers and staff!

Please join us on April 20th to create this important space for our community and for wildlife. A range of tasks will be available for all different skills and abilities. Work gloves, bottled water and sun protection are recommended. Students are encouraged to join. We hope to see you there! Shout out to Allison Cassel for leading the initiative!


